Charles D. Shambaugh, born Dec. 31, 1812, Faternal Great Grandfather was an officer of French Government on the Rhine. Religious views protestant. On account of religious intolerance he immigrated to America.

His son Danial served in the Revolutionary War, participating in the Battle of Brandy Wine. The father of our subject, Jacob S. was born in Fennsylvania 1777 and when 12 years of age accompanied his parents to winchester Virginia and when of age married Mary Barrow, born in Winchester 1785. They then lived in the Shenandoah Valley. Miss Barrow was a daughter of Captain Barrow of English descent, who served at Winchester under Washington.

C.D. Shambaugh married Mary Jane Shembaugh, a native of Virginia, February 5, 1835. Matilda Kargaret, was born Nov. 20, 1835 and died April 27, 1856, aged 30 years, 5 mos. and 7 days. Martha Ellen, was born Jan. 31, 1838 in Warren? Co. Va. who died March 14, 1838. (Ed. this line was different writing, so could not determine if it applied to Martha Ellen or not.)

Mary Jane Shambaugh, wife of Charles D. Shambaugh departed this life February 1972 aged 22 years. 7 months and 21 days.
