The 1970 Shambaugh National Reunion was held in Des Moines and Winterset, Iowa Sept. 4, 5, 6. Over seventy guests registered on Sat., Sept. 5 for the SI Dinner-Meeting held at the Uptown Terrace Restaurant, Des Moines, Iowa, which was hosted by the Iowa Shambaughs.

Marjorie Meyer Bucklelew, who had driven in from Seattle, Wash. led the group in spirited singing of Shambaugh parodies on familiar songs. Each guest identified his family, his residence, and occupation, as well as his interest in the Shambaugh history. This was enjoyed by everyone as we became better acquainted.

On Sunday, Sept. 6, we met at the Gold Buffet Dining Room in Winterset, Iowa. A most attractive and delicious dinner was enjoyed by the guests. Group photographs were taken at this time.

The Shambaugh National Reunion held its business meeting during the afternoon in the Multi-Purpose Center. It was convened by Dr. G.I.G. Shambaugh, Pres. Honor is always due Dr. Benjamin F. Shambaugh (deceased 1940) an illustrious faculty member at the University of Iowa. A book, "A History of the Constitution of Iowa" written by Dr. Shambaugh and a second volume, "Benjamin Franklin Shambaugh, as Iowa Remembers Him" were auctioned. They were purchased by LeRoy F. Shambach, Middleburg, Penn. This generous purchase price was credited to the Shambaugh Genealogical Fund to promote further research.
