We have spoken of the three Georges, and for the sake of clarity your editor shall from this point on refer to them as follows (G) George. (C) George and (D) George the reason for the intials being that, in the first case we follow from from this George through a George line; in the second case we follow down through a Christian line, and in the third case through a Daniel line. Michael and Hettie Shambaugh of New Rumely, Harrison Co., Chio, to a point fifteen miles west of Des Moines near where the village of Booneville was later founded. Of these six, four returned to their eastern hills but Adam H. and John Shambaugh remained to make their adjoining farms their lifetime homes.

Blessed with unusual physical strength and with boundless enwere their children given better than average educational advantages, but friends
and strangers alike were welcomed to their homes and helped in every possible manner. They and their devoted wives were intensely loyal to their entire relationship and to all who called on them and were especially loyal to their church- the
United Brethren Church to which they belonged in Chic. Every College, Seminary,
Missionary and charitable institution was a beneficiary of their generosity. The
Union Chapel was built in 1873 on Shambaugh ground and stands in perfect repair to
pectable pioneers.

Riverside, Cal.: William E., Orin C., and Lloyd Shambaugh live on farms near the old Homestead; Mrs Lois S Castleberry and Scott Shambaugh live in Houston, Texas. J. Jacob Shambaugh of Des Moines is the son of John Shambaugh. There are also 36 living descendents in later generations.

had two sons, George II and Philip, the latter being the father of twelve children and among whose descendents can be named such well known Shambaughs as the late Professor Benjamin and his brother Dr. George Shambaugh of Chicago, and their cousin C. A. Shambaugh, an attorney of Carlisle, and many others

who married Ratherine (Anna Catherine) Reger and who had seven children, vax., George III; Jacob who had eleven children of whom Rev. Adam Shambaugh was the oldest and Abraham of Lafeyette, the youngest; John with his thirteen children became the forefather of Mrs Cogsill and all the Carroll Co., Ohio Shambaughs; Philip who married Elizabeth Kessler and has seven children; and three daughters, Barbara Hokenhouse, Katherine Holts and Nancy Brown. GEORGE III bern 1787 died 9/4/67 married Elizabeth Brown Wirt in Penn. and moved with his family of four children (Philip., Michael. George IV and Margaret), together with his younger brother John and his family, to Harrison Co.. Ohio, in April 1817. Here they and all their children lived and died and here many of their descendents yet live.

MICHAEL b. 6/18/1811 d.3/20/1863 secondson of George III was the father of ten children. The eriginal Chic homestead is still ewned and eccupied by the widow of Michael's youngest son, a total of 123 years of Shambaugh occupancy.

fifth child of Michael and the father of nine children. Born 9/11/1840, marred 9/11/1862, died 4/4/1927
