NATIONAL SHAMPAUGH REUNION -

The 27th National Shambaugh Reunion was held Sunday Sept 5th 1971 in Rossville, Ga. at the homeplace of Franklin Guy & Lela (McFarland) Shambaugh's children at 1407 McFarland Ave.

The host's for the Reunion this year were Mrs. Mary Alice (Shambaugh) Dantzler - President, Mr. Franklin Robert Shambaugh, Mrs. Harry (Ruth Shambaugh) Nave, Mr. Mac Allen Shambaugh and their families.

Co-hosts were Mrs. Harry (Cleo Shambaugh) Gervin of Gatlinburg, Tenn. and Dr. Nona Grapes of Selma, Ala., Vice President, and Miss Lela Diane Nave, Secretary.

On Saturday all of those who had arrived early were treated to an open air buss tour of Chickamauga National Park. Then at 6:30 p.m. the crowd gathered at Lake Winnepesaukee for a picnic supper and a watermelon cutting. The young folk enjoyed all the attractions while the older ones got in a lot of visiting.

Sunday, about eleven, the "Shambaugh's" began to gather under the big tent in the front yard of Mary Alice Dantzler's home. The Red Carpet having been spread to welcome them. After posing for pictures at 12:45 p.m. the invocation was given by Mr. Albert Harshberger, then a delicious dinner was served.

Mr. Franklin Shambaugh introduced the Mayor, Mr. Paul Ellis, who welcomed the Reunion to our city, also adding a few other remarks pertaining to the Franklin Guy Shambaugh Clan.

We then had a ten minute break after which the President, Mary Alice Dantzler, called them together again by giving her welcome to one and all. Several songs were sung being led by Franklin Robert Shambaugh accompanied by Mrs. Frank Manly of Cleveland, Tenn. Mr. Shambaugh then favored the crowd by singing a solo "His Eye is on the Sparrow", dedicating it to the memory of his father, Franklin Guy Shambaugh. The entire group sang "How Great Thou Art", with Bryan and Margaret Alice Dantzler singing the last verse.

During the business session the rising cost of postage for the News-Letter was discussed pro and con then Mr. Harold Shambaugh made the motion that price of the News-Letter be increased to \$1.50 as of this Reunion time. The motion was seconded and carried. Invitations for the next Reunion were given by Mrs. Alice Bosson of Cadiz, Ohio and Mr. Flavius Leightey of Upper Sandusky, Ohio. A vote was taken with Cadiz receiving 44, and Upper Sandusky 3. Our next meeting will be in Cadiz, Ohio with those in Cadiz electing their own officers.

Dr. G.I.G. Shambaugh of Shambaugh International presented a check for \$25.00 to Mrs. Mary Alice Dantzler to be used by the hosts toward expenses. He then asked to have four new people elected to the International Board by secret ballot. This was done and Mr. John Howard Shambaugh, Mr. Franklin A. Shambaugh, Mr. Harold Shambaugh, and Mr. Bryan Dantzler were elected. He then asked to have two teenagers elected for the S. I. board. Miss Diane Nave and Roger Shambaugh were elected.

Dr. Shambaugh also talked on Project Tail-gating, a cause of many accidents, asking for volunteers to distribute 100 stickers each in their own communities. 5 accepted.

A hat was passed around for luncheon expenses. \$99.00 was received and this was given to Mrs. Mary Alice Dantzler to be used at her discretion.

\$25.50 was collected for News-Letters. Lists of deaths and those who had been ill or in hospitals since last year were read.

Greetings from those who could not attend were also read.

Treasurer's report of S. I. given by Dr. G.I.G. were: in checking account -\$122.59 in Savings account (interest & donations). In Retired Maintenance Fund, to take care of cemeteries especially the Shambaugh graves and Genealogical Fund, \$578.78.

The floor was turned over to Mr. Harold Shambaugh of Silver Springs, Md., who talked on Genealogy research. The George Shambaugh line (only) he began with Adolph Shambach who arrived in America aboard the passenger ship Mortonhouse from Rotterdam on August 17th 1727. The children of Adolph and Arna Dorothy were, Elizabeth, George, Valentine, and Catherine.

One hundred attended the Reunion with Mr. Flavius Leightey and his wife being the only two he had never missed a Reunion since it's beginning in 1940. There were eleven states and the District of Columbia represented.

Several attended for their first time, but old or new all seemed to have a wonderful time. A number stayed over until the next day so the afternoon was spent visiting and eating.
