He, also is a man of excellent attainments and wide influence in his profession.

THE SHAMBAUGHS OF COMBERLAND COUNTY, Pennsylvania

The following account is taken from an article in the Oumborland County History under the heading of Levi J. Shembergh.

The Shanbaugh name has been upon the Cumberland County records since 1793. That year a Philip Shambaugh was taxed with a hundred acres of land and two horses and two cows in the part of West Pennsbero township that is now included in Frankford township. He may have been in the county prior to this "Wh this entry is the first documentary evidence of his having been here. It does not appear where he had lived before coming to Cumberland County, but, according to family tradition, he came here from Dauphin County, and his ancestor named George Shambaugh came from Germany in 1749, and first settled in Montgomery County, Fenn.

Philip Shembaugh died In 1844; at the age of 83. For several years prior to his death he was totally blind. His wife survived him and died in the home of her son George, in Frankford township, at the age of 89 years. Both are buried in the grave yard of the Stone Church in Lower Frankford. Of the history of his wife's family not much can be ascertained.

This Philip Shambatgh had children as follows: Poter, George, Philip, Barbara, Stophen, Anna, Mary, Hannah and Margaret. Of these children Stophen and Anna died young: Barbara married Jacob Reigle and moved to Chic, Mary married Martin Mounts of Frankford, Hannah married a Mr. Leopard of Porry County and Margaret married a Mr. Shugart of Porry County.

Philip Shambaugh's son Philip was born October 8, 1789 and was yet a little child when his parents settled in Ounberland County. On April 34, 1826, he married Anna Margaret Wert, who was born in Upper Paxton township, Rauphin County, March 31, 1802, and was a daughter of Joseph and Barbara (Kitch) Wert, among the early pioneers of Pennsylvania. Philip Shambaugh II, died April 15, 1846, at the age of 57 years. He was man who was held in high esteen by his neighbors for his integrity, modesty and general good character. His wife, Anna Margaret, died in June 1871, and their remains are buried in the graveyard of the Stone Church in Lower Franks.

Philip and Anna Margaret (West) Shambaugh had children as follows: Sarah. John. Rebecca, Jacob. Myine, Samiel. Philip A. and her J. Sarah married Adem Finkon-binder and lived in West Perisboro two. She and her husband died near Miliottsen Penn. John married Eva Armessler and moved to Clinton Co., Iowa. Rebocca married George Bistline Oris of Frankford Two., where both she and her husband lived and died.

Jacob, when a young man, went to Iowa and there enlisted in the Army and was killed in the battle of Iuka, Miss. Sept. 19, 1862. Miving died at the age of sixteen. Somet manifed fane H Brown of North Middleton Two, and moved to Missouri; but af ter live years there returned to Frankford Two, where both he and his wife died. Philip A. enlisted in Nompany O. 158th Penn. Volunteer Infantry, and after nine months Service came home with impaired health. He afterwards went west and located near Oakley, Macon Co. Illinois where he married Nannie Philips.

Levi J. Shambaugh, the youngest child, was born Sopt, 14, 1843, on his father's ream on the north side of the Conodoguinet Creek in Frankford Two, a short distance to the northwest of Plainfield, Fonn. His father died while he was yet less than three years old and he was left entirely in the care of his mother. He was sent to the country district school until he was eld enough todo manual labor, and then lived out on a farm at two dollars a month during summers, and went to school in the winters.
