THE SHAMBAUGH FAMILIES AND THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO AMERIC A

(The story of Dorothy, Ludwig, Anna Maria and Valentine of Bucks County with their families as put together by Harry Gleim,)

Besides George, Daniel and Philip whom we have definitely identified as sons of George of Bucks County there are four other names connected with the group in Bucks and Montgomery Counties two of whom seem definitely to have been children of George and the other two of whom must have been closely related.

The Superior Court order of 1804 identifying Daniel and Philip as heirs of George Shambaugh of Hampshire County, West Virginia, also names Dorothy who had married Jacob Snyder. From the records of the Wontz Reformed Church of Worchester township in Montgomery County we find that Jacob and Dorothy are listed as the parents of a son John who was born May 25, 1775. The sponsors of this child were Elizabeth Snyder and Goorge Shambach, both single. Then, in addition to the Superior Court Order noted we also find that Jacob Snyder was owner of land in Fred erick County, Virginia. We do not know when Jacob Snyder died but his land seems to have been sold to a Michael Hauck and the deed dated Nov. 22, 1821 lists as signors, Dorothy, his wife, and four children, asson Jacob who seems to have been unmarried, the John whose birth date we have noted whose wife's name was Mary, learge whose wife's name was Ann, and Elizaboth who had married Henry Waller. Snyder: 8

Now, as to Ludwig, or Lowis as he is somotimes called, we first note that he was confirmed March 29; 1771 at the Goshonhoppen Reformed Church at the ago of fifteen. The Tohickon Reformed Church lists the birth of a daughter, Margaret who was born Sept. 27, 1786 and gives his wife's name as Catherine. IV 1796 he purchased land in Froderick County, Virginia which he sold in 1801. He is not mentioned in the Court order of 1804 which leads us to believe that, like George who went to Snyder County in Pennsylvania; he was probably too far away to be includedd in the paper. All other indications point to his being a son of George and a brother to George Jr., Daniel . Philip and Dorothy.

I have never been too sure that there was an Anna Mariavin this family. We do find the name used in connection with church records and also find that the name appears in connection with other members of this family

This really completes the story of George of Bucks County and the families of his sons and daughters whose descendents account for almost 1900 of the first tabulation of 3,500 announced by Mrs Castleberry, Later tabulations will greatly increase this number.

With the next two issues we will complete the story by telling you of the children of the two sons of George of Lancastor County whose mathematical increase equals or exceeds that of the other George. It seems stronge that these families who were so prelific when America was new are new dying out. There have been too many late marriages and too many marriages without children.

We have spent two years on this section of our story. Next year we move into the fourth generation and it will be interesting to note how this grand (grober strad family scattered out and helped to build many communities of this great country.

VALENTINE SHANDAGE AND HIS VANILY

The following information about Valentine Shambach, who was a resident from the official records of these two counties and from the records of the church to which members of this family belonged. We are told that he was a Quaker, or non-affirmer, however, his children and their families seem to have been confirmed in the Wents Dutch Reformed Church in Lower Providence township in Montgomery, County.

Valentine Shambach was born Dec. 31, 1724 and died August 31, 1808.

His wife's name was Agnes and we have her birth date as Feb. 15, 1727 and she seems to have died previous to 1804 for a codicil to his will of that date does not mention her.

dren, while in the codicil referred to welfind mention of an Wisabeth who might have been a fourth, she being deceased at that time. Two of the three named in the will were girls; Mary, Born in 1740, married John Hugler. From the church records we find that she had two sons, Joseph Hugler born April 10, 1775 and Benjemin Hugler, born Dec. 26, 1776. Dorothy the other daughter was born in 1751 and married John Pennybacker. We find no record of children born to her. The Panybacker.

The oldest child of the family was the son, Philip born May 25, 1747 whose wife, named Lydia, Was born Nov. 12, 1768. Philip died October 10, 1822 and his wife died June 18, 1835. The church records list two children born to them, Velentine, born March 15 and Agnes, born May 26, 1790

The church records mention a "Velty" Shambo with two children born to him, and it has accurred to us that this might have been a name used for the youngest Valentinet This is further born out from the fact that one of his children was Lydia, born November 11, 1811. The other child was named William and he was born March 10, 1813. We note that Philip was named as testator in the baptism of this younger Lydia.

From the Wentz records we have another Philip, a Philip who married a girl named Hannah Summers. From previously verified data we know that this one could not have been the Philip and Hannah referred to in other records. This Philip had eight children, the second being a daughter named Lydia ann who was born August 19, 1827, an older sister, Angelina having been born February 8, 1825. From these dates and the name Lydia it would not seem to be a very wild guess to hint that we believe that this Philip might have been a third child born to the older Philip and his wife Lydia sometime between 1792 and 1804. The other children in this family were Jackson Summers, born June 8, 1828, Harriet Elizabeth, born May 16, 1830; Albanus Washington, born Feb. 13, 1832, Martin Leffieth, born Sept. 15 1834 and the twons Charles Philip and mannah Rebecca, born August 11, 1836.
