The Shambaugh Families Society held their 9th. National Reunion in the Ashland Ohio fairground on Sept. 6th. with the President Dale Shambaugh presiding. Minutes of the last reunion, held in Upper Sandusky, O. in 1951 were read by the secretary. Mrs Grace Leightey, with Mrs Rosalind Shambaugh assisting with the registration and name tags. (The 1952 reunion was postponed because of the polio epidemic). Around 100 Shambaugh's were present for another enjoyable get-together, and a basket dinner that was far beyond our capacity to consume. The blessing was asked by Mrs Myron Spade of Ind.

A feature of the dinner was a cake baked and decorated by Mrs Maxine Kohler Ager which had "Shambaugh National Reunion" written on the top.
