Clark O. Bender of 1367 Blvd. Way, Walnut Creek, Calif. who is Traffic Manager in Capwell's Dept. Store in Oakland tells of his interesting hobby of raising orchids. He has some 1000 orchid plants, from seedlings to the flowering plants, growing in three hothouses which are equipped with complete automatic controls for temperature, humidity, ventilation and other devices to numerous to mention.

Clark says it takes from 5 to 8 years for an orchid plant to bloom, in nature they bloom upside down. His chief assistant is his wife Florence. They belong to several Orchid Societies and have several varieties, including the vanilla orchid which grows to a 15 foot vine, vanilla extract can be processed from the seeds.

In addition to the orchids, they have 400 Bird of Paradise and a few hundred other interesting plants.

Clark is a Shambaugh by a former marriage to Faye Shambaugh who died in 1940, both were formerly of Marion, Ohio. They had two sons, Nohl and Warren with their families also live in Calif.

Stewart, 79, Pres of the First National Bank of Jewett, O., died Sunday Oct. 11, 1953 of a cerebral hemorrhage, in the Ohio Valley Hospital. He owned and operated a hardware store in Jewett for 50 years, and was a member of the Jewett Methodist Church.

He was a native of Rumley Tp. Harrison Co. born March 6, 1874, a son of the late James and Elizabeth Shambaugh Stewart. He leaves two brothers, Rev. William H. of Dennison, O. and Charles of the home, and two sisters, Anna and Carrie also of the home. He was preceeded in death by three sisters, Laura, Rebecca and Effie and a brother Leonard.

Stewart, on Jan. 25, 1954, was accorded honors at the Dennison Methodist Church which he served for 13 years, including a 1000 dollar scholarship fund established in his name in recognition of his 24 years as a minister. This "William H. Stewart Scholarship Fund" will aid ministerial students at Mt. Union College in Alliance, Ohio.

Rev Stewart was 85 years old this February, and began his ministry in 1900. They live at 311 N. Second St. Dennison, O.

Among the 57 voters in Rumley Tp. Harrison Co. Ohio, in 1827, were three names of the Shambaugh line - George Shambaugh, Joseph Gotschall and John Manbeck.

Carroll Co. (also a Shambaugh Co.) was formed by parts of Harrison, Jefferson, and Tuscarawas counties in 1833.
