These Reunions have grown to be very important affairs in the lives of those whose name in Shambaugh, together with their in-laws and relatives. Each year we have found new faces at these meetings and we hope that this year will bring together all of the old attendants and many, many more new ones.

One matter of business will need our attention this year. The original constitution of the Shambaugh Families Society contained the rule that those who wished to belong to the Society should pay a yearly fee of \$1.00 per family which would also give them the News-Letter. At last year's Reunion the thought was expressed by some that all blood-relatives of the Shambaugh lines should be automatically considered as members and that those wishing the News-Letter should pay a \$1.00 yearly fee for that privilege. The change was not regularly made, but it can be made at the Reunion this year if that is the desire of those present.

THE 27th SHAMBAUCH-DEFFLINGER REUNION was held July 25, 1948 in Arlington, Iowa. The Shambaugh's in this group are descendents of Chas B. and Thos. E. Shambaugh, sons of Jacob Shambaugh who migrated to Iowa from Virginia in 1855 following the death of their father. Harloy and Dale Shambaugh, Mrs Elma Ross, Mrs Bertha Knowrr and your editor are all members of this particular group. Mrs Gertrude Stapel of Celwein, granddaughter of Chas D. Shambaugh and Mrs Elma Ross of Arlington, granddaughter of Thos E. Shambaugh were re-elected as president and secretary of the Arlington group.

Mrs Boyd was the daughter of Charles and Caroline Simpson Shambaugh, Her father was a brother to James Shambaugh, founder of the town of Shambaugh, Iowa and father of Ira W Shambaugh of Clarinda, Iowa. These two were sons of Isaac Shambaugh, he a son of Philip Shambaugh, brother to Daniel Shambaugh. It was our good fortune to have twice visited Mrs Boyd and she was a wonderful person to know.
