BCONE? IOWA - The Rev. Harry W. Gleim. 77, who was ordained by the Methodist Church at 64 after two successful previous careers, continues as supply pastor for two Boone County churches - although he formally retired five years ago.

The Rev. Mr. Gleim was the son of a pioneer lowa purebred Holstein dairy farmer near Arlington. Graduating from Arlington High School, the future minister had two ye rs of dairy industry courses at lowa State Univ. before setting up his own herd.

Later he set up a purebred Holstein pedigree and sales organization, also acting as secretary of the Iowa Holstein Breeders Assn. for three ans one half years. He associated his business with the Hainy Publishing Co. of Webster City, publisher on livestock journals. If wrote the catalog for a Minnesota livestock sale at which the Holstein bull Carnation King Sylvia brought \$105.000 - then the highest price ever paid for a bull, the Rev. Mr Gleim said.

Shifting to another career in 1926 to the Ft. Dodge IMCA for two years, then to Burlington IMCA for four years, then back to Ft. Dodge Until 1946. Then accepted a call to the ministry at Hardy Nebr., also studied theology in summer school sessions at the Perkins Seminary in Dallas, Texas.

The ministers first wife, the former Jessie Simpson died in 1951. Several years later he married Mrs Frank Kreamer, a Waukon widow. In 1954 Rev. Gleim filled two pulpits of Ong and Eggar, Nebr. whose members lived in a 200 square-mile area, having a 30 mile trip each Sunday.

Returning to Iowa in 1957 and preached at the Dike Methodist Church for three years, then moved to Boone, and serves the Mackey and Mineral Ridge churches, driving many week - day miles visiting members in an area from Story City to Pilot Mound.

Meanwhile, has given devoted care to Mrs Gleim who is seriously ill.
